Effective March 7, 2011:
Los Vaqueros Watershed North Side
Closed To All Public Recreation
While Reservoir Expansion is Underway

Recreational facilities on the Watershed's South Side (including the Marina, boat rentals, trails and shoreline fishing) remain open to the public.

The Contra Costa Water District is constructing the Los Vaqueros Reservoir Expansion. The reservoir will be enlarged enough to hold 160,000 acre-feet of water (from its current capacity of 100,000 acre-feet). This will ensure water quality and supply reliability for the 550,000 people served by the reservoir.

To ensure public safety during heavy construction, the north side of the watershed will be closed starting March 7, 2011. It is expected to reopen prior to August 2012. In addition to this closure, there will be no "Vaqueros Days," "Bike and Hike," "LV Dam Trials," or "Wildflower Run" events held in the watershed this spring.

The south side of the Watershed is still open, and you are encouraged to visit the south side, as well as neighboring recreation areas. (See map on reverse.) The Watershed Office on the north side of the watershed is also open for business purposes. The District regrets any inconvenience this may cause and appreciates your cooperation with its efforts to ensure public safety while this important project is completed.

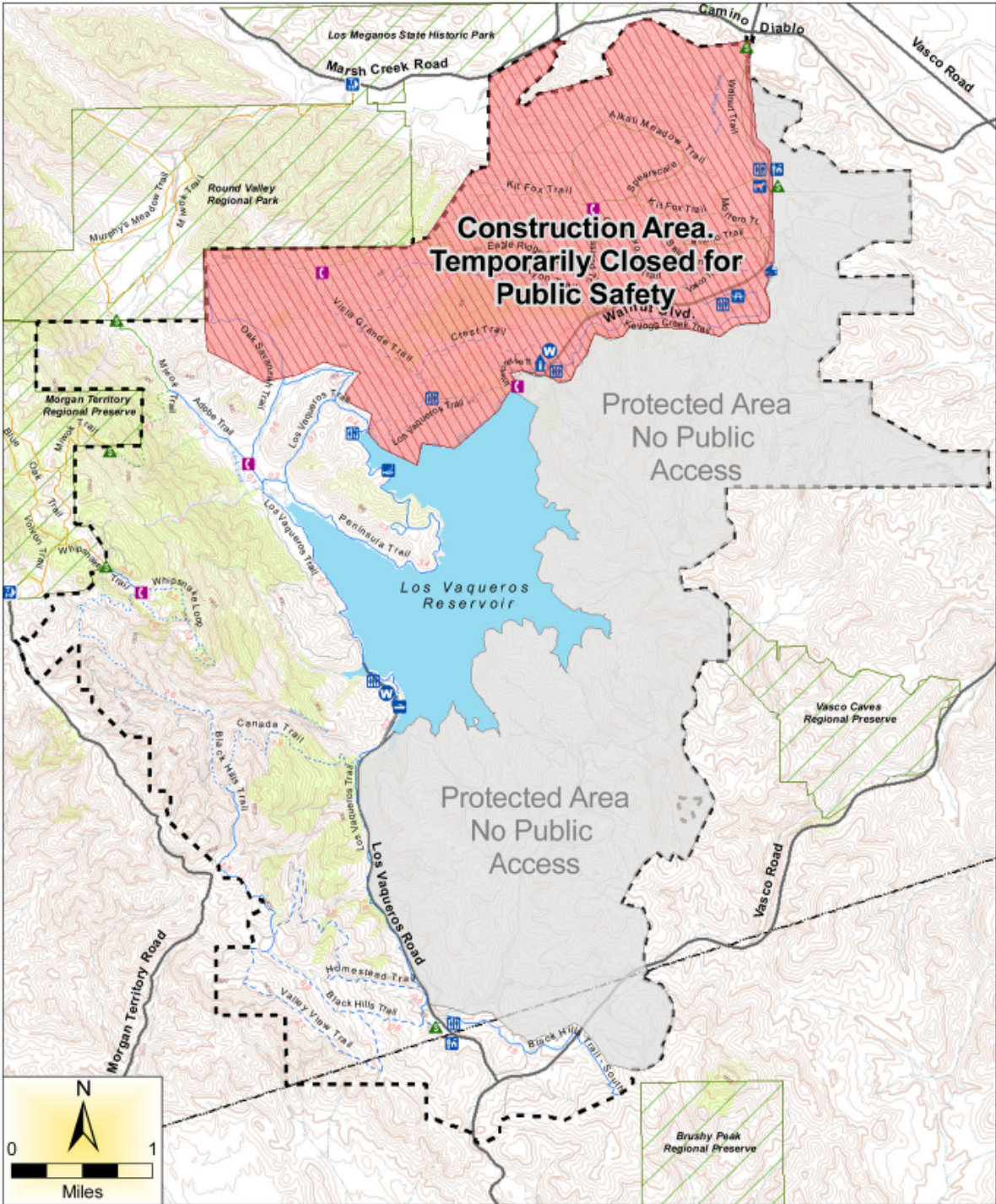
