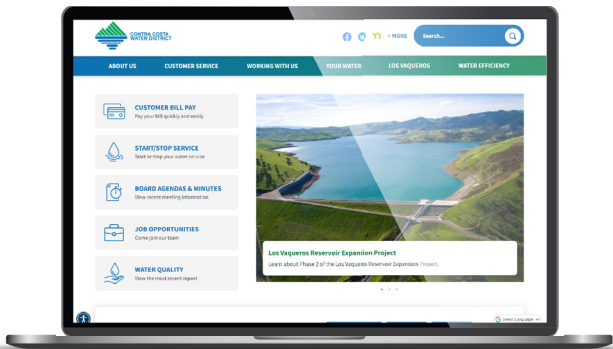

The water level at Los Vaqueros Reservoir was down 55 feet, holding just less than half of its total capacity, on November 17, 2022.

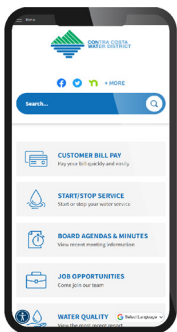
