INVITATION TO BID

SEALED BIDS will be received by the Purchasing Officer of the Contra Costa Water District (District) at 1331 Concord Avenue, Concord, California until **10:00 a.m., October 2, 2018** for the **Margie Drive & Vicinity Main Replacement Project, Project Number 118601**. As soon as practical thereafter, they will be publicly opened and read for performing Work as follows:

Furnishing all labor, materials, except for those materials supplied by the District as set forth in Paragraph 01010-4.0, **DISTRICT FURNISHED MATERIALS**, equipment, and performing all work necessary and incidental to the construction of the project known as the **Margie Drive & Vicinity Main Replacement Project** according to drawings and specifications as prepared by the Contra Costa Water District and according to the Contract Documents.

The Work includes, but is not limited to, mobilization and demobilization, the installation of approximately 5,100-feet of 6-inch and 8-inch diameter polyvinyl chloride (PVC), ductile iron (DI), and welded steel pipe (WSP) water mains and appurtenances, abandonment in place of existing mains and appurtenances, transporting of materials, on-site storage, excavation, sheeting, shoring, bracing, draining, collection and disposal of all treated water contained within the existing pipes and all water used to flush new installed pipes, disposal of any ground water encountered to the local storm drain in accordance with all applicable requirements referenced in Paragraph 01060-2.1, **Dewatering – Governing Regulations**, whichever is most stringent, for discharge of water to the local storm drain systems, backfill, compaction, site restoration, tie-ins and replacement of water service laterals, concrete and asphalt concrete (AC) pavement surface repairs and restoration, curb and gutter concrete repairs and restoration, traffic control, and obtaining encroachment permits from the City of Pleasant Hill and Contra Costa County Flood Control District.

The Project site is located within the City of Pleasant Hill.

The Project shall achieve Substantial Completion 210 days after Notice to Proceed is issued, and Final Completion shall occur **within thirty (30) days thereafter**, pursuant to Paragraph 00810-2.0, **TIME ALLOWED FOR COMPLETION**. Time for commencement and completion of the Work is important, and is to be of the essence of the Contract.

A prebid conference and job site visit will be held at **10:00 a.m. on September 13, 2018**.

Prospective bidders should meet at **Contra Costa Water District, Board Room, 1331 Concord Avenue, Concord, California**. Prospective bidders must supply their own hard hats, safety glasses, reflective vests, and work boots, and wear them during the job site visit. For job site visits at the District's Contra Costa Canal, prospective bidders must also supply their own personal floatation devices, and wear them during the site visit. The District is not responsible for supplying Personal Protection Equipment (PPE), and prospective bidders will not be allowed to attend the job site visit if they fail to supply and wear the required PPE.

Although the job site visit is not mandatory, no allowance will be made for any unfavorable conditions or events which might have been foreseen from a thorough examination of the site by the Contractor. No other job site visits will be scheduled.

Bidders may obtain copies of the bidding documents at 2411 Bisso Lane, Concord, California. A non-refundable charge of **forty dollars (\$40)** in the form of a check payable to **Contra Costa Water District** will be required for each set of documents.

A set of the documents may be obtained via the mail upon payment of **fifty dollars (\$50)** per set. (Send requests and check for project drawings and specifications to Contra Costa Water District, 1331 Concord Ave., Concord, CA 94520, Attention: **Bid Coordinator**.)

Bidding procedures are prescribed in the Contract Documents. Bids shall be executed upon the separately stapled bid forms provided, which are provided for convenience in submitting bids and are not a part of said Contract Documents. If there are any discrepancies between the stapled bid forms and the Contract Documents, the Contract Documents shall take precedence. Bid guarantee, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total bid dollar amount and conforming to the prescribed bidding procedures, is required to be submitted with each bid as a guaranty to be forfeited should the bidder, if awarded the contract, fail to enter into the same, or fail to furnish in a timely manner, the bonds and/or proof of insurance.

In addition, pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 2204, each bidder submitting a bid in which the Total Amount set forth on its Bid Schedule is **One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000)** or more must also submit with its bid the **IRAN CONTRACTING ACT CERTIFICATION**, in the form included as Section 00400, and, except as otherwise specified in Paragraph 00100-26.0, **REJECTION OF BIDS**, the failure to submit the **IRAN CONTRACTING ACT CERTIFICATION** may render the bid non-responsive. Public Contract Code section 2205 establishes penalties for false certifications.

Pursuant to Section 1770, et seq., of the California Labor Code, the successful bidder shall pay not less than the prevailing rate of per diem wages as determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations. Copies of such prevailing rate of per diem wages are on file at the office of the **Engineering Department, 2411 Bisso Lane, Concord**, where copies will be made available during normal working hours to any interested party on request, or Bidders may prefer to obtain the current prevailing rate of per diem wages directly from the website maintained by the California Department of Industrial Relations (<http://www.dir.ca.gov/dlsr/pwd/index.htm>). This project is subject to labor compliance monitoring and enforcement by the California Department of Industrial Relations.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22300, for moneys earned by the Contractor and withheld by the **Contra Costa Water District** to ensure the performance of the Contract, the Contractor may, at its option, choose to substitute securities meeting the requirements of said Public Contract Code Section 22300.

All bidders shall be licensed under the provisions of Chapter 9, Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California to do the type of work contemplated in the project. In accordance with provisions of California Public Contract Code Section 3300, the District has determined that the Contractor shall possess a valid Class **A OR C-34** License at the time that the bid is submitted. Failure to possess the specified license shall render the bid non-responsive.

The Contractor shall not be qualified to submit a bid to perform the Work unless it is registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Labor Code Section 1725.5 at the time that the bid is submitted. Failure to have registered and thereby be qualified shall render the bid non-responsive.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish the following: Payment Bond in the amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract price; Faithful Performance Bond, in the amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract price; and evidences of insurance in full compliance with requirements set forth in Paragraph 00820-2.0, **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS**.

Each bidder shall submit with its bid a statement setting forth its experience on the forms included in the Bid Proposal.

Telephones will not be available to bidders for the preparation of the bids or for calling in bid results. Bid forms received after the designated time will not be accepted. Bidders and their authorized agents are invited to attend the bid opening.

No bidder may withdraw its bid for a period of sixty (60) days after the date set for the opening of bids.

The District reserves the right to reject any or all bids; to make any awards or any rejections in what it alone considers to be in the best interest of the District; and waive any irregularities in the bids.

The successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against on the basis of age, color, race, national origin, ancestry, religion, gender, sexual preference, marital status, and comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act.
