

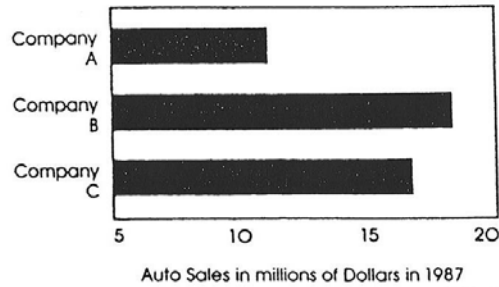

Chart and Graph Selection - Types of Charts

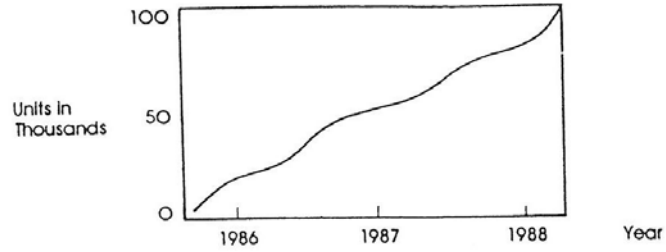
PERCENT—Shows a comparison as a percentage of the whole. Usually uses the pie chart or map chart.



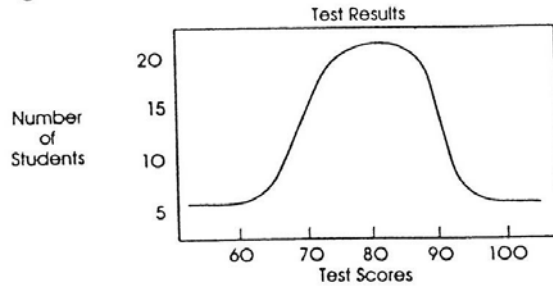
PARTS—Shows how items compare or rank. Usually a bar (horizontal lines) or column chart (vertical lines).



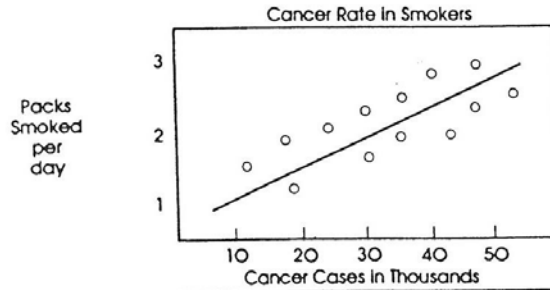
TIME—Shows changes over a period of time. Column or line charts are most typical.



FREQUENCY—Shows the number of items in different numerical ranges. Column and line charts are also used here.

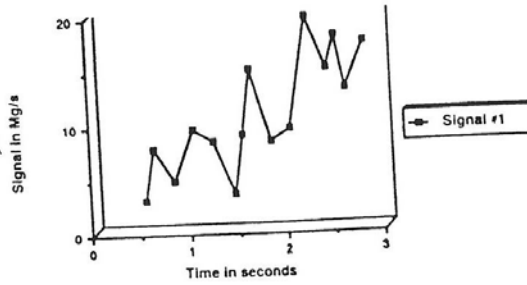


CORRELATION—Shows the relationship between variables. Bar charts and dot charts are used to illustrate correlation.



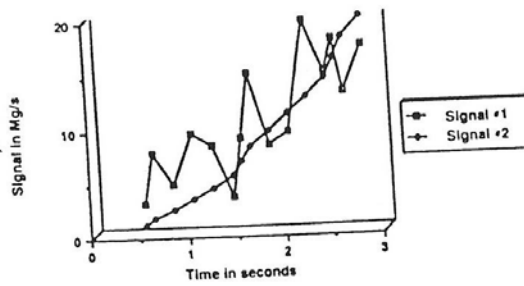
